The right of the people peaceably to assemble. The United States Constitution, Amendment $\mathbf{1}$.

To assemble a group of Free Persons. Among other Things. (Examples specifically are given and particularly noted in the Amendment are given like religion, the free exercise of religion, the free press, and free speech; the freedom of such; then this statement.)

Statements...

If the persons are 1) Free Persons; and 2) are aware of Right; and 3) protect the rights of others; and 4) protect the rights of entities -- then, they have a right peaceably to assemble a group, an individual self-world-space, a family and like interconnected and juxtaposed world-space, a social society-like awareness, a professional association, a corporation, a corporation or organization of society-like awareness, a useful thing, a philosophy and philosophical view, a religion and religious view, an economic system, a just system, a state, and a nation.

A Free Person is...

- 1. Rights and Right-Minded.
- A. This protects their own rights, and its awareness; and it protects the rights and Right of others.
- B. This offers a natural and intelligent and ethical domain in personal, societal, common, corporate, communal, economic, and social development and arrangements.
- 2. An ontologically free being Free person.

It also has to be a Freedom. That is, a free and just society. This includes the above. The Freedom is something shared, and is also and liberation, freedom; and is protected.
